Big things happen when you donate to the National AIDS Housing Coalition. Thanks to your generosity and support we have been able to have a major legislative win in a tough congressional climate. The HOPWA Formula Update is now a reality. With the passing of the Housing Opportunities Through Modernization Act (HOTMA - P.L. 114-201, July 29, 2016), the HOPWA Program switches from cumulative AIDS cases to living HIV/AIDS, makes HOPWA comport with the Ryan White Care Act, and directs HUD to include housing costs and local poverty rates as formula factors. HOTMA phases in a formula change over five years, factoring in local housing costs and poverty rates, and capping grantee losses at 5% and gains at 10% of the prior year allocation. We would not be able to move forward in this direction without your support.

Now we focus on fair implementation so that no jurisdiction is put in the position of denying housing to PLWHA and further modernization to take place so that policies match the funding allocations. For the HOPWA Formula Update to be successfully implemented, we need to have more money allocated to the program. All this will take strong advocacy.

Whether it's advocating for better laws, increased funding, fair allocation of funding or more housing units for PLWHA, shaping the future starts with you. Regardless of how much you give, every donation matters!
